The Anger of Moses

Scripture Reading: Exodus 32:11-21

God said to Moses that He will destroy all the Israelites and make Moses a great nation. Then Moses pleaded with the Lord his God, and said: "Lord, why does Your wrath burn hot against Your people whom You have brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians speak, and say, 'He brought them out to harm them, to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth'?" So, the Lord relented from the harm which He said thought He would do to His people. When Moses came down the mountain from the presence of God, he saw the calf and the dancing. So, Moses' anger became hot, and he cast the tablets out of his hands and broke them at the foot of the mountain. Then he took the calf which they had made, burned it in the fire, and ground it to powder; and he scattered it on the water and made the children of Israel drink it.




