Judah -I will Praise the Lord

Answer:

When Leah gave birth to Reuben, Simeon and Levi, she said things concerning herself, about what had happened to her and named them accordingly. But when Judah was born, she said 'I will praise my God" and then named him. Though prayer can be considered as the most important aspect of a believer"s life, praise is a very important part of prayer. A person who truly praises God will be victorious in everything he does and will be exalted by God. That"s the reason we have to learn to worship God in spirit and in truth.
