Question:

The little girl was not at all angry with Naaman who alienated her from her Parents, relatives and her country and brought her as a slave to his nation nor did she have bitterness in her heart that they made her as a slave to work in his place at the age, were she was supposed to study.

She had compassion over Naaman who was effected with leprosy in the house where she was there. Her actions were clear to trust in her words, This slave girl would have been the same age like the one who is reading this. compared to the little girl's situation, you are living in a comfortable place right? to how many of your friends in your school have you told about Jesus? in the coming days, tell them about the miracles and good things that Jesus has done for you. if any among them doesn't give heed to your word do not be angry with them rather start praying for them. if somebody whom you know is down with sickness, pray for them every day. This little girl was the reason for the nation of Syria to know about Christ.
