

The Meek

Scripture Reading: Proverbs 14:29; 16:25-33; Matthew 5:5

When we look at some people we immediately say that they seem to be very meek and when we look at a few we immediately judge that they could be very boorish or rude. To be quiet always doesn't mean to be meekness. Meekness is an intermediate character between anger and calmness.

A few people cannot even bare a word against them but will immediately be filled with fury and could even start responding with their hands and legs. They will start using inappropriate language. They will have sleepless nights until they have taken the revenge. However, what kind of a person are you?

You might say, how can I hear all that people say against and still not respond? Will not people think I'm a fool?
