Give Power to the Weak

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 40:28-31

We've read that our God who protects us neither sleeps nor slumbers. Today let us meditate on another trait of our God. The bible says, "The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.
