

Scripture Reading: Psalms 104:1-31

Omniscient God

Omniscient means all knowing. Those who have studied to be doctors and engineers may not know about the law. Those who have studied the law will not have knowledge about inventions. Scientists will not know about philosophy. Philosophers will not know about medicines. There is no human or a machine or a book or anything that has completeness of knowledge in itself. But God is an all knowing God. He knows all that which has happened, all that is presently happening and all that is about to happen with the clearest details. He's the one who gave all sorts of wisdom to mankind. He alone possesses all the wisdom.

We gain knowledge by learning. We gain wisdom by the measure in which we rightly apply the knowledge we have received. For example, a doctor is fully aware that smoking is injurious to health. This is knowledge. He has the knowledge. But when he himself smokes? That means that he does not have the wisdom to use the knowledge in his own life.

To be wise is better than having abundant knowledge. Wisdom is to know what to do? Where to do? How to do? Why to do? To whom to do? And so on using the knowledge you have gained. But the wisdom of God is more complete and perfect than this. Observe the creation and the deeds of God; it is so much filled with wisdom.

He alone is all knowing God, 1 Timothy 1:17. To the only wise God be glory forever through Jesus Christ! Amen. Romans 16:27. "How many are your works, Lord! In wisdom you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures" Psalms 104:24. If you lack wisdom, ask of God. He will fill you with His perfect wisdom.
